Teams presenting work include:

# Orthopaedics Team, Hull

Antonio Ramirez & Carole Chapman

This presentation looks at creating a culture of safe prescribing including transcribing of medication and reasons for delays when patients are admitted. Antonio and Carole will describe the challenges they encountered using real life examples and their exciting ideas for the future.

# Theatres Team, York

This presentation will discuss the methods of how the team implemented the Surgical Checklist for surgical emergencies in the acute setting, despite initial scepticism from staff that 'it couldn't be done'.
